More training & support programmes available for you to access

Our talented team of staff and volunteers have pulled together a depth of relevant materials for you to explore and deepen your understanding of mentoring. I am delighted to let you know that you will be able to start accessing these resources online throughout January, February and March.

We are also really pleased to have further training sessions for you to attend where you can. Our training is now being broken into 3 broad categories. We have our 'Core Training' which is a requirement for everyone participating. Under a 2nd heading of 'Advanced Skills' with the support of some other really committed and highly qualified individuals and organisations, we have pulled together a detailed programme. We will send this round in the New Year with some options to choose from.



The 3rd heading is then all about 'Pathway Toolkits' and making sure you know all the many sources of information and support based on the pathway your young person is on. There will be a range of resources you can use with your mentee from Skills Development Scotland, My World of Work, Focus West and SQA.
