## On June 14th, we were absolutely delighted to be announced winners of a CSJ Award 2021!

The Centre for Social Justice is an independent think tank which partners with grassroot charities across Britain, as well as experts from across the world, to tackle the root causes of poverty and social breakdown.

The team visited us in April and spent time talking to Emily from St Margaret Mary's in Castlemilk about her journey through school. Joining the programme in 2017, Emily took part in groupwork, mentoring and Talent Tasters, and continued to be supported by her fantastic Pathways Coordinator Irene and mentor Elaine, even throughout the recent pandemic. A massive thank you to Emily and Elaine who took part in a short film created especially to showcase the impact of mentoring.

#### MENTORING EXPANDS ACROSS THE COUNTRY

It has long been our ambition to make mentoring a right for all care-experienced young people across the nation. This year, we've made enormous strides to achieving that goal.

#### **NEW MATCHING SYSTEM**

Our fantastic new digital matching system was launched at the start of the 2021, designed to increase the speed and quality of mentoring matches. Now, as part of our matching process, both young people and prospective mentors tell us about their passions, personality and pathways to build an understanding of their interests, experiences and career goals. From there, a score is generated for each mentor in relation to each young person in their selected schools, allowing our Pathways Coordinators to guickly shortlist mentors for their young people and make a fully informed choice.

This powerful platform will continue to improve as we grow and offer future opportunities to further analyse our matching performance.

On a recent catch-up with a young person from Hazlehead Academy who has been mentored since November 2021, **the pupil said that having her mentor, Lynn, to speak to has helped make her feel a bit more confident.** On reviewing her well-being web, she also identified that she feels more listened to as a result of having someone to speak to.

#### ABERDEENSHIRE

At Banff Academy, pupils taking part in the SI YST Group Work recently **spoke about their lives using the story cubes they constructed with pictures** they felt made their stories true to life. It was a fun and enjoyable session as they all got to know one another more.

#### **CLACKMANNANSHIRE**

While mentoring through lockdown, Alloa Academy mentor, Colin, created fun ways to interact with his young person through Zoom. Now that they're able to meet face-to-face, **Colin has been creating model planes with his young person.** They've been planning, assembling and painting together. The sky's the limit with this pair!



#### **EDINBURGH**

One young person from Wester Hailes Education Centre was planning to return to school after the summer, but recently decided **she would like to go to college full-time to study Dance.** She has only been meeting with her mentor for a couple of months virtually and didn't have any applications in for college.

Recently, during their second face-to-face meeting, the pupil's mentor, Taciana, supported her to write her personal statement and complete the college application. They have a great relationship considering they had to start their relationship virtually and have only met in-person twice!





#### GLASGOW

We've had so many great stories from all 30 schools in Glasgow throughout the year. As tough as it's been not being able to meet with the mentees face-to-face, both our young people and mentors have been resolute!

For mentor Marianna and pupil Sofia\*, from Shawlands Academy, they were recently able to meet in-person for the first time since last year. With the virtual mentoring options not suiting Sofia, Marianna was very patient and often contacted the Pathways Coordinator to pass on messages to Sofia. We're delighted to see this pair and many other relationships meet up as restrictions ease!

#### **NORTH AYRSHIRE**

As some schools have been allowed to meet their young people face-to-face, for many, it will be their first time meeting after months of chatting virtually. At Auchenharvie Academy, one young person was thrilled at having the chance to meet their mentor. Mentee, David\*, was waiting for the right mentor and, now that he's found them, **he visited the Pathway Coordinator's room several times to find out when they could finally meet and they've now been allowed to meet in-person!** 



#### SHETLAND

It's been amazing to see more mentoring relationships blossom in Shetland! Miriam, who started meeting her young person in December, has loved mentoring and it fills her with so much joy:

"From the word go, we both basically couldn't stop speaking, and found common interests immediately. It was only our third meeting when the young person mentioned how much she is looking forward to each meeting - and I couldn't agree more! It makes my heart sing to see my mentee really enjoying having somebody listening to her without any judgement, but to also give some guidance."





#### SOUTH LANARKSHIRE

For years, Craig\*, who attends Cathkin High School, was detached from school and other services. After meeting and working with William, the school's coordinator, his attendance went from 30% to 90%! With the improved attendance, Craig could be matched with a mentor.

Craig was matched with Steph and the pair hit it off in their recent first meeting! **He even wanted to send Steph a message afterwards saying something that he forgot to mention during their opening chat.** An amazing turnaround!

#### WEST DUNBARTONSHIRE

Caitlin\*, who is in S4 at Our Lady & St Patrick's High School, will soon be leaving to study Child Care at college. Having had the support of her mentor for some time, Caitlin is feeling confident about the future and had this to say reflecting on her time being mentored:

"I really enjoyed having a mentor, it was so good to have someone to talk to and to give me advice. My mentor was so lovely and we have become friends. If any other young person was unsure about getting a mentor, I would say just give it a go, as it helped me in so many ways."
